REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, Memorandum & Articles of Association of the company, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

A Board of Trustees comprising not less than five and no more than eighteen persons, who are elected at the organisation's Annual General Meeting, govern ACCURO. At each AGM, all members of the Board of trustees must retire, but all are eligible for re-election.

In addition, up to a maximum of five additional trustees may be co-opted at any time, by the Board of trustees and this may include one representative from Essex County Council.

The Board currently operates a sub-committee with particular responsibility for overseeing financial matters.

Risk Management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. To this end, trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed. This has identified the continuing external risk posed by future funding uncertainties & the perceived over reliance on funding from one particular source (i.e. Essex County Council). In response trustees have embarked on a review & updating of the organisations Business Plan which will include plans to encourage an increased diversification of funding sources.

Trustees have continued to ensure compliance with the agreed specific internal procedures relating to all financial transactions and review these procedures at least annually.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of ACCURO, as stated in the Memorandum & Articles of Association by which ACCURO is governed, are:

"To relieve people with disabilities and / or elders who reside in Essex and surrounding areas by the provision of respite care and other services for which there is an identified need and such services will encompass the need to provide support and training to volunteers and staff."

Vision Statement

"To improve the quality of life of people with disabilities and their families in Essex and surrounding areas by achieving full access to a diverse range of services"

Mission Statement

- To provide local, flexible, responsive & diverse services for with people with disabilities and their families;
- To create a person-centred environment where people are empowered to increase control over their own lives through exercising choice.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During 2014/15 we operated the services listed below:

A Shared Care service that provides respite care for children with a disability, provided by a combination of volunteer & fee paid Shared Carers. This service closed in February 2015 when the contract with Essex County Council was not renewed

A social & leisure activities scheme for adults with a disability.

Saturday Play Clubs for children with a disability.

A Holiday Support Project that provides leisure & social opportunities for children/young people with a disability during all school holidays thereby also providing their families with some respite care.

An Under 19 Leisure and Social Opportunities Project.

A Parenting Support Project

A youth group for children/young people with autistic spectrum disorder who reside in the Harlow area. This service is being delivered in partnership with PACT (Harlow)

A youth group for 11 to 19 year olds with a disability who reside in the Loughton area. This service is being delivered in partnership with ignite Youth Services.

A Community Gardening Project that provides opportunities for adults with a disability to learn/develop a range of skills & to make a positive/active contribution to their local community in Saffron Walden & the surrounding areas.

A performing arts group for 11 to 19 year olds with a disability, delivered in partnership with Razed Roof

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The policy of the organisation continues to be to maintain a minimum of three months running costs as reserves. This reflects the concern of the trustees that they should maintain sufficient reserves to meet any unforeseen circumstances and in particular, to meet the organisation's obligations, in the event that the charity / limited company has to be wound up.

Reserves may be either restricted or unrestricted and these are identified and described in the accounts which are attached to the trustees' report.

Investment policy and objectives

Under the Memorandum & Articles of Association the charity has the power to make investments at the discretion of the trustees. The current policy of the charity is to invest surplus funds in bonds with the Nat West Bank to achieve maximum return. Alternative opportunities are kept under constant review.

Financial management

Responsibility for managing the finances of the organisation lies in the hand of the Board of Trustees. The trustees delegate some control for day to day management of income / expenditure to the Chief Executive Officer but retain their overall control.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees (who are also directors of ACCURO (Care Services) for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (Effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures and Fittings - straight line over 3 years

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Leasing

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to Statement of Financial Activities as incurred.

Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable are charges to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Taxation

The company is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

13 PENSION COMMITMENTS

The company contributes to a defined contribution pension scheme for the benefit of employees. The amounts included in the accounts represent the contributions paid during the year, which were £10,105 (2014: £5,222).

14 INFORMATION ON RESTRICTED FUNDS

Shared care scheme

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council. The scheme provides respite care for children with a disability provided by volunteer and fee paid Shared Carers, in the carers own home or by taking the child out. The project closed in February 2015 when Essex County Council decided not to renew the contract relating to its delivery.

Holiday scheme

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council. The scheme provides additional support to children / young people with a disability during the school holidays.

Adult friendship scheme

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council. Some restricted funds were generated via fund raising activities. The scheme provides support to adults with a disability.

Community gardening scheme

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council, the Lloyds Foundation and the Bailey Thomas Trust. Various donations were received in the year restricted to this scheme and some restricted funds were generated via fund raising activities.

Under 19's scheme

Funding was received in the year from various donations which are restricted to this scheme. The scheme provides leisure and social opportunities for young people with a disability aged 11 to 19.

Saturday club scheme

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council and Lloyds Foundation. Various small donations were received in the year restricted to this scheme and some restricted funds were generated via fund raising activities. The scheme provides a Saturday play club for children with a disability.

Parental support project

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council, the West Essex Care Commissioning Group, Harlow Council and The Mulberry Trust. This project has been designed to provide a wide range of services (e.g. parenting programmes, signposting, etc.) to parents of children with a disability.

Loughton Youth Group

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council. This project provides a youth group for 11 to 19 year olds with a disability who reside in the Loughton area. This service is delivered in partnership with ignite Youth Services.

Cool Connections (formerly Autistic Spectrum Disorder group)

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council and the Big Lottery Fund. This project provides a youth group for children/ young people on the autistic spectrum who reside in the Harlow area. This service is delivered in partnership with PACT (Harlow).

Sitting service

Funding was received in the year from Essex County Council. This project provided domiciliary care in their own home for children/ young people with a disability. It closed, due to lack of funding, in November 2014.

BEAMS

Funding was received in the year from Games Aid. This project provides a performing arts group for children/young people with a disability in the Epping Forest and Harlow areas. It is delivered in partnership with Razed Roof.
